Recently comments have been made in the local press about the quality of the water in Grahamstown. Prep has installed an industrial reverse osmosis water filter at the Senior Prep and at Fairlawn, whilst water containers for drinking water have been installed in the Boarding Houses. Hypotonic is also freely available to supplement the body's mineral requirements.

The University is working in tandem with the Makana Municipality to monitor the situation and weekly testing is being conducted. The latest information based on these tests shows that, from a micro-biological perspective, the water is safe for human consumption. The situation is being monitored closely by the College.

In conclusion, our Grade 7s enjoyed a wonderful outing along with their counterparts at DSG last Sunday afternoon. The activities involved ice-breakers and, judging from the responses from the boys, this was a very worthwhile and enjoyable occasion. EXTRA-CURRICULAR MUSIC GROUPS
